Recently, Cleabel Hernandez (PHNE-161) of The Phlippines fell while playing a jumping game with friends. The result was a hip fracture. At first, she was not treated because the family could not afford medical help. Once the staff of Grace Family Helper Project learned of her condition, they went into action. Through

our emergency fund, Cleabel had surgery with screw fixation in order to repair the hip. She is now undergoing physical therapy, learning to walk again. She recently wrote, "Thank you for helping me...the big amount you gave made my surgery possible and successful. At present, I can't walk alone, I'm still on therapy twice a week. I thank you so much for providing my surgery needs until now." **REAL IMPACT!**

### **NEWS CLIPS**

- Annual Statement: Every donor was mailed a statement in January 2016 that shows your total giving for 2015. This will be your tax record.
- Friendly reminder: Monthly sponsorship amounts have changed. New prices are \$32 (was \$25), \$38 (was \$30), and \$50 (was \$40). Thank you for supporting the children at these new rates. This was implemented in August 2015 and is effective as of February 1, 2016.
- It is important to remember that COP CANNOT receive packages of gifts for children to be sent overseas. If you send toys, games, candy, etc., we cannot send those items in the mail. We can only send flat things to children that will fit in a greeting card-sized envelope, i.e., **bookmarks**, **photos**, **stickers**, etc.
