Sponsorship is officially open in the country of Guyana. Children in need will be served in four communities in the greater Georgetown area (capital): John Street, Plaisance, Sophia, and Stewartville. The monthly sponsorship amount is \$32. Children will receive nutrition, education, health, and spiritual benefits. Executive Director Dr. Paul Maxfield visited Guyana in August and officially opened the program at the Centennial Celebration of the Church of God. Director of the new program, Sheena Collins, has prepared the first applications and we are eagerly awaiting the first sponsors!
